TEEN Fiction Chappell: Total Constant Order Upset when her family moves from Vermont to Miami, high-schooler Fin develops OCD and becomes consumed with numbers, counting, irrational worrying, and germs.

TEEN Fiction Dreyer: The Glow Stone Sixteen-year-old Phoebe wonders if she will suffer chronic depression like her recently-deceased uncle, who shared her passion for rock-collecting, until the terrifying experience of being lost in a cave provides the answer.

TEEN Fiction Ellis: Everything is Fine When her father leaves for a job out of town, Mazzy is left at home to try to cope with her mother, who has been severely depressed since the death of Mazzy's baby sister. Also try **Easton's** To Be Mona

TEEN Fiction McCormick: Cut While confined to a mental hospital, fifteenyear-old Callie comes to understand some of the reasons behind her self-mutilation. Also try **Stoehr**'s Crosses

TEEN Fiction Neufeld: Lisa, Bright and Dark Sixteen-year-old Lisa suffers from a nervous breakdown that only her closest friends seem to notice and care enough about to try to find a way to help her.

TEEN Fiction Stork: Marcelo in the Real World Marcelo Sandoval, a seventeen-year-old boy on the high-functioning end of the autistic spectrum, faces new challenges when he goes to work for his father in the mailroom of a corporate law firm.

TEEN Fiction Vizzini: It's Kind of a Funny Story A humorous account of a New York City teenager's battle with depression and his time spent in a psychiatric hospital.

TEEN Fiction Bingham: Shark Girl After a shark attack causes the amputation of her right arm, fifteen-year-old Jane struggles to come to terms with her loss and the changes it imposes on her life.

TEEN Fiction Bray: Going Bovine Cameron Smith, a disaffected sixteen year-old who, after being diagnosed with Creutzfeld Jakob's (aka mad cow) disease, sets off on a road trip with a death-obsessed video gaming dwarf he meets in the hospital in an attempt to find a cure.

TEEN Fiction Cummings: Blindsided After years of failing eyesight, fourteen-year-old Natalie reluctantly enters a school for the blind, where in spite of her initial resistance she learns the skills that will help her survive in the sighted world.

TEEN Fiction Downham: Before I Die A terminally ill teenage girl makes and carries out a list of things to do before she dies. Also try **Crutcher**'s Deadline

TEEN Fiction Friesen: Jerk, California Plagued by Tourette's syndrome and a stepfather who despises him, Sam goes on a road trip designed to help him discover the truth about his life.

TEEN Fiction Grab: Alive and Well in Prague, NY

Matisse Osgood and her artist parents move to upstate New York when her father's Parkinson's disease worsens, and Matisse must face high school in a small town as she tries to avoid thinking about her father's future.

TEEN Fiction OWNING: Owning it: stories about teens with disabilities.

Presents ten stories of teenagers facing all of the usual challenges of school, parents, boyfriends and girlfriends, plus the additional complications that come with having a physical or psychological disability.

TEEN Fiction Sonnenblick: Drums, Girls, & Dangerous Pie

When his younger brother is diagnosed with leukemia, thirteen-year-old Steven tries to deal with his complicated emotions, his school life, and his desire to support his family. Also try **Plum-Ucci**'s What Happened to Lani Garver

TEEN Fiction VAN DRAANEN: The Running Dream

When a school bus accident leaves sixteenyear-old Jessica an amputee, she returns to school with a prosthetic limb and her track team finds a wonderful way to help rekindle her dream of running again.
