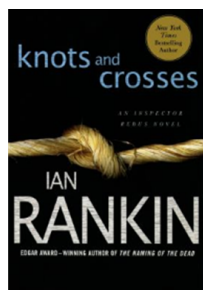

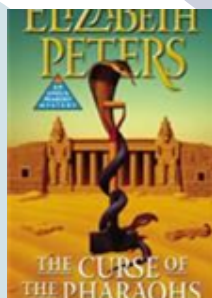


Knots and Crosses

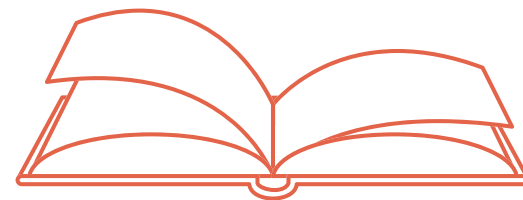

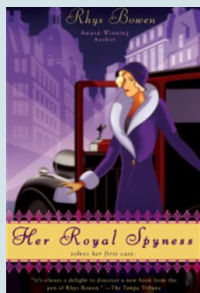

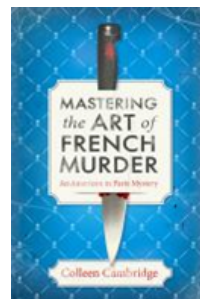
The Woman in the Library

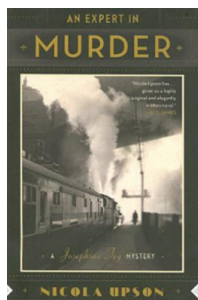

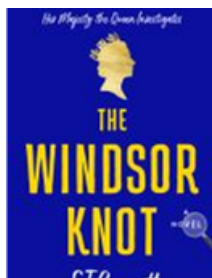
