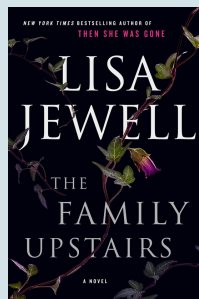
The Four Winds

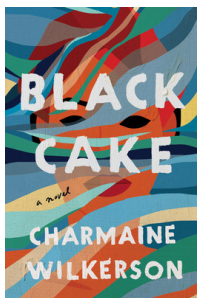

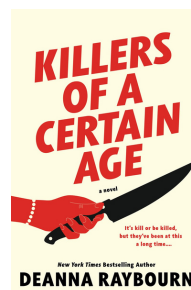
Malibu Rising

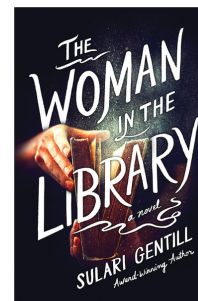
