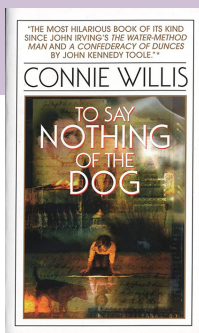


*The Spare Man*

At a century-old Tokyo coffee shop rumored to offer patrons the chance to travel back in time, four customers reevaluate their formative life choices.

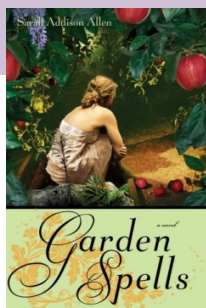


### *Garden Spells*

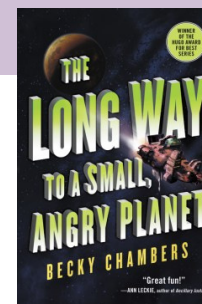


### *The Long Way to a Small, Angry Planet*

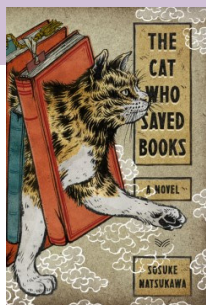


### *The Cat Who Saved Books*

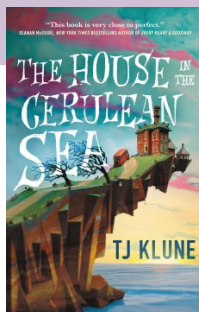


### *The House in the Cerulean Sea*

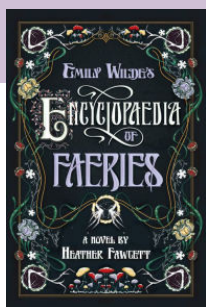


### *Emily Wilde's Encyclopaedia of Faeries*

In the early 1900s, a curmudgeonly professor journeys to a small town to study faerie folklore, where she discovers dark fae magic, friendship, and love.

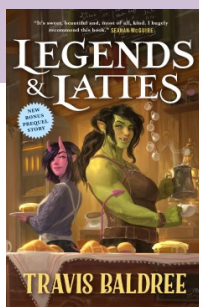


### *Legends & Lattes*
