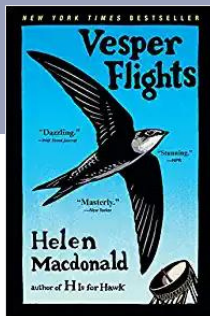


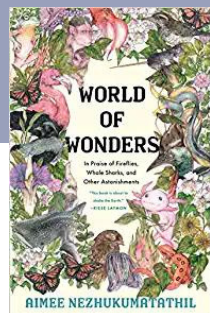
*The Treeline*

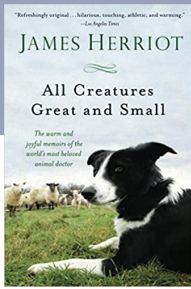

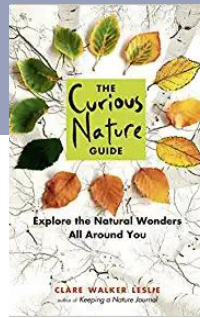

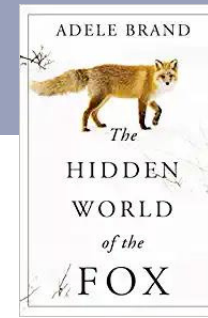
*All Creatures Great and Small*

A country veterinary surgeon in Yorkshire describes the joys and trials of his profession and recalls his early career and experiences with his unique clientele.



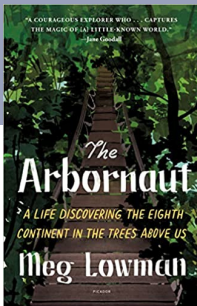
*The Curious Nature Guide*

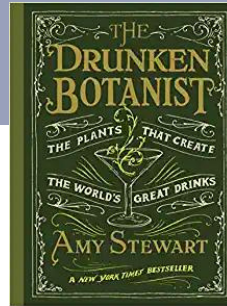
*The Hidden World of the Fox*

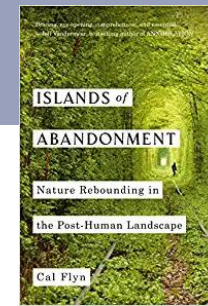
*The Arbornaut*

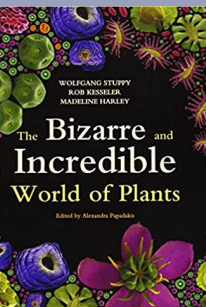
*The Drunken Botanist*

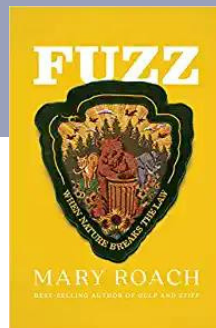
*Islands of Abandonment*

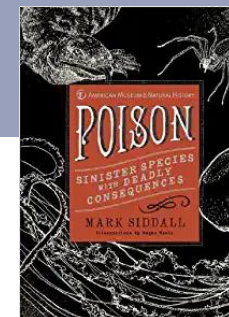
*The Bizarre and Incredible World of Plants*
