


The Treeline By Ben Rawlence 2nd Floor, SCIENCE / NATURE / ENVIRONMENT / RAW

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


2nd Floor, ANIMALS / STORIES / HER A country veterinary surgeon in Yorkshire describes the joys and


The Hidden World of the Fox By Adele Brand 2nd Floor, ANIMALS / MAMMALS / BRA

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
The Arbornaut By Meg Lowman 2nd Floor, SCIENCE / NATURE / TREES / LOW


The Drunken Botanist By Amy Stewart 2nd Floor, 581.632 STE


Islands of Abandonment By Cal Flyn 2nd Floor, SCIENCE / ENVIRONMENT / FLY


The Bizarre and Incredible World of Plants By Wolfgang Stuppy, et al. 2nd Floor, 580 STU
