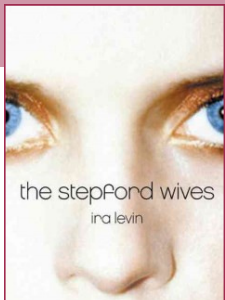


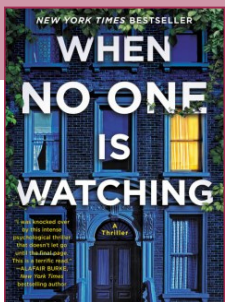
The Only Good Indians

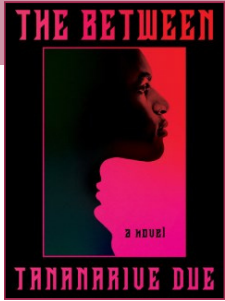

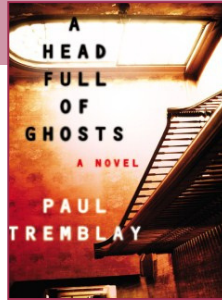

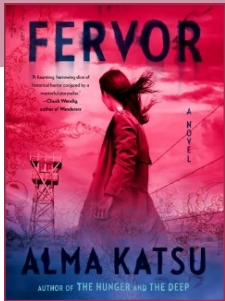
A Head Full of Ghosts

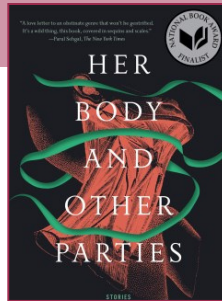
Lone Women

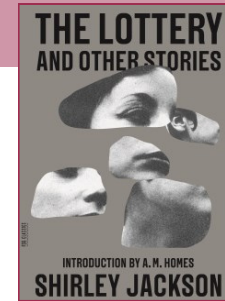
The Fervor

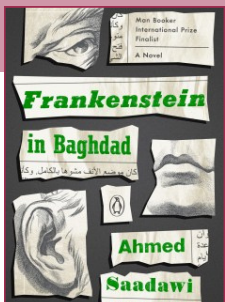
Her Body and Other Parties: Stories

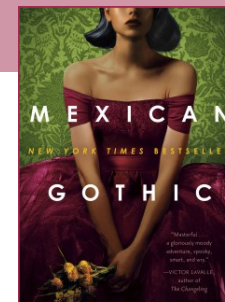
Frankenstein in Baghdad
