


Poetry is for everyone,

and it connects us to our own experiences and to those of others.

Ways to approach poetry:

- Leave behind your preconceptions about poetry, as well as any negative experiences you've had in the past. Expect not to "get" or like every poem you read.
- Bring your natural curiosity and belief in your abilities.
- Recognize that poems speak in many ways through methods like form, repetition, rhythm, word choice, spacing, rhyme, etc.
- Read a poem more than once--you know what they say about first impressions. There is NO reason that anyone should understand a poem on the first read.
- Spend time with the poem:
 - Read it silently and out loud. Read it again;
 - Read and listen for rhythm, pace, flow, rhyme, etc.;
 - Look at it. Is it titled? Long or short? Breaks between lines? Long or short lines? All of these and more are used by poets to write poetry;
 - What brings the poem to life for you?
 - What comes to mind when reading it? Images?
 Sounds? Memories? Emotions?
- Perseverance will reward you, but you do not have to like a poem or continue to read a poet you don't enjoy.
- There are many books available and you can start with one of the books recommended here.






